LOCAL RULES

PLEASE AVOID SLOW PLAY AT ALL TIMES

The Rules of Golf as approved by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club shall apply and in addition the following Local Rules:

I. OUT OF BOUNDS

A ball is out of bounds if it comes to rest within practice area:

- (a) To the left of the white stakes on the 9th fairway and the 10th fairway.
- (b) Over the garden or allotment fences forming the perimeter of the course.
- (c) On or over the footpath and steps at the 17th hole boundary wall.
- (d) To the left of the white stakes on 18th hole, and any path or paved area surrounding the Clubhouse & Starters Pavilion.

2. RELIEF

- (a) A Ball landing on the right-of-way roadway through the course may be lifted, without penalty, and dropped in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-2b(i) (Immovable Obstruction) (a free drop within one club length from the nearest point of relief not nearer the hole).
- (b) A Ball coming to rest near or against young or staked trees - If such a tree interferes with a player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the ball must be lifted, without penalty, and dropped in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-2b(i) (Immovable Obstruction).

- (c) The fences at or near the 1st, 2nd, 7th, 18th tees and the 6th and 17th greens are immovable obstructions.

A ball may be lifted, without penalty, and dropped in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-2b(i) (Immovable Obstruction). Any wall, fence or other object defining the boundary to the course is not an obstruction.

- (d) If a player's ball lies in an area of "ground under repair" from which play is prohibited, or if such an area interferes with the player's stance or the area of his intended swing, the player must take relief under Rule 25-1.

- (e) During the period 1st October to 30th April preferred lies shall apply unless the committee shall declare otherwise. A ball lying on any "closely mown area" through the green may, without penalty, be moved or may be lifted, deaned and placed within 6 inches of where it originally but not nearer the hole. After the ball has been so moved or placed, it is in play.

- (f) Stones in bunkers are moveable obstructions (Rule 24-1 applies).

- 3. The pumphouse on 2nd fairway is an immovable obstruction; relief may be taken.
