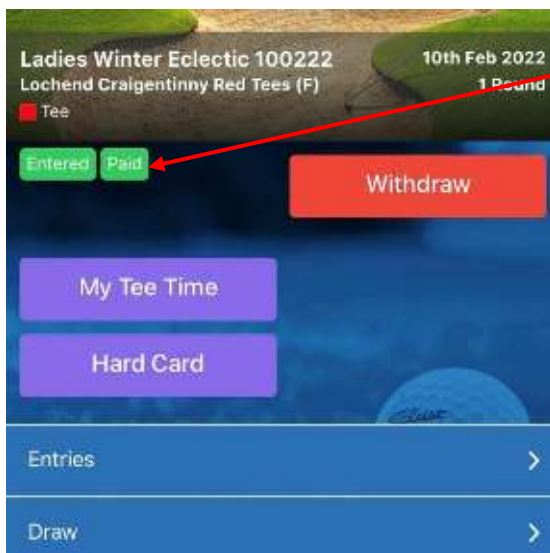




## LOCHEND GENTS SENIORS OPEN 30<sup>th</sup> SEPTEMBER 2022

- Entry is available via the Scottish Golf App (“Opens” section).  
The [Online Entry Form](#) (on our web site) is also available and will collect all the mandatory information and it will automatically be sent to Lochend GC.  
Note: Lochend Members only need to enter via the SG App. Also, non-members who had played in the 2021 Lochend Gents Opens or this year’s Gents Open only need to enter via SG App as we already have your details.  
**If you enter via the SG App, you can now choose your Tee-Time. This is available via the Green “My Tee-Time” option. And is available on a first come first served basis.**  
**Entry is only guaranteed once payment of entry fee has been received by Lochend GC**
- Alternatively, you may choose to send your entry form (along with the cheque) direct to Lochend Secretary (Hard Copy Entry Forms available on SG App or, Lochend Web Site).

**Once payment has been received your status (viewed on the SG App) will show “Paid”**



- Scoring on the day will be via SG App however, cards will be available in case of any technical problems, so please ensure you take one with you.  
There will be an IPAD available for anyone to check in and score afterwards if they don’t have the SG App.  
When non-members enter, they will be given a guest status at Lochend and a Membership Card will be available on the SG App (My Membership Cards) once entry has been processed. We hope you enjoy your day.
